#### **Boys' Albion Cup**

Another week, another trip to BHA training ground - this time with the years 5 and 6 boys teams. This was only the second time in the history that the tournament was full! 160 players, 20 teams.

We took two teams to the tournament and the predominately year 6 team were pitched in a very tough group, losing 3-11 and 1-0 before winning 2-0. The tournament ended with a match against a very impressive Orchards School A team and the boys lost 6-0! They were outstanding. The boys tried hard in all the games and played football the right way and despite finding some of the opposition very strong, they never gave up.

The second team had won their first three games quite comfortably - and if they won their last game - they would ensure that they didn't meet Orchards until at least the semi-final stage! However, after a slightly off-colour performance, they lost 2-0 ensuring they finished 2nd in the group and it was indeed Orchards in the 1/4 final.

However, after a bit of a pep talk, the boys gave absolutely everything in the match and drew 0-0 - sending the game straight through to penalties. The boys scored all 5 of theirs and Orchards missed their last penalty - meaning NLS progressed to the semi-finals! In those semi-finals, a very polished performance saw us beat TAB 2-0 and make the West Sussex Final.

In the final, a combination of tiredness, nerves and general poor initial play saw us 3-1 down with 4 minutes to go.

However, setting up a thrilling finish, we scored once and then again to make the score 3-3 and send us to penalties again! Despite missing our first penalty, Harley saved one and then eventually scored the winning penalty - saving again from the Petworth goalkeeper afterwards - to secure the first ever Yr 5/6 Albion Cup title for North Lancing.

We are not a 'huge' school in West Sussex by any means and to win the overall tournament is wonderful. A bit of luck was required, and lots of lessons were learnt during the day - the boys have now managed to qualify for the Sussex finals in November. What an amazing day!
